

Saving and tagging websites using delicious.com – how folksonomy helps teachers manage digital resources.

If you are using an IWB, then your use of internet digital media in the classroom will have increased dramatically. Computer based bookmarks can only do so much. Printed lists of web addresses become cumbersome and unusable. The only way to save and manage your own digital library effectively is to move it onto the web. delicious.com is a social bookmarking website (there are others like Furl, BlinkList and Diigo) that uses the power of tagging and folksonomy to allow anyone (but especially teachers) to take control and use the "wisdom of others" to save time in locating more resources.
